Niagara Children's Centre - Program Descriptions

INFANT AND PRESCHOOL SERVICES (BIRTH – SK ELIGIBLE)

Early Intervention and Preschool Therapy Teams: Provides coordinated occupational therapy, physiotherapy, speech-language pathology and social work service with developmental pediatric input for clients with multidisciplinary needs.

Specialized Group Therapy: Provides education and activities for infant and preschool clients and their caregivers in specific areas of need.

- Parent language training programs e.g., "More Than Words", "It Takes Two to Talk", "Talking Hands"
- Feeding groups e.g., "Happy Meals", "Snack Attack"
- Jump and Jive and Wiggles and Giggles Encourages development of gross motor skills
- Get Set to Print A pre-printing program to develop readiness for future printing and cutting
- Stepping Stones A social and learning group experience for children 18 36 months

Specialized Preschool Programs: Provides nursery and preschool programming for clients ages 2 - 5 years with multidisciplinary needs.

SCHOOL AGE SERVICES

School Age Therapy Team: Provides physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech-language pathology and social work to clients who have had a significant change in function, acquired injuries or are new to the Niagara Region.

School Intervention Team: Provides physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech-language pathology and social work and augmentative communication support for children enrolled in the Niagara Children's Centre School.

SERVICES OFFERED FOR ALL CLIENTS (BIRTH TO 21 YEARS)

Unidisciplinary Services: Provides physiotherapy services for clients of all ages with gross motor limitations, occupational therapy for infants and preschoolers with fine motor and sensory needs.

Communication Assessment and Support Team (CAST): A designated ADP clinic that provides high- and low-tech communication aids for clients whose speech and writing does not meet their daily needs. Education about augmentative communication is also provided.

Developmental Pediatric Clinic: Provides diagnostic services to children with developmental delays through consultation with a Developmental Pediatrician.

Physical and Rehab Medicine Clinic: Provides consultation with a Physiatrist for clients regarding diagnosis and plan of care including transition to adult care.

Gait Lab: Provides a 3-dimensional analysis of the gait cycle for clients with atypical gait patterns.

Orthopedic Clinic: Provides orthopedic consultation with an Orthopedic Surgeon for clients with developmental delay or neurological involvement.

Splinting/Casting Clinic: Provides casts and basic splints (not orthotic devices) for clients with orthopedic or neurological impairment. This clinic provides services for upper and lower extremities.

Psychology Services: Provides cognitive assessment services to support planning for educational and therapeutic resources to aid in the client's development.

Seating Clinic: Provides power and manual wheelchairs, strollers and inserts to clients without functional ambulation. Education on seating systems and assistance in obtaining funding are also provided.

Pool Programs: Provides aquatic therapy and swim instruction for clients who require water as a modality to reach their functional goals and/or clients unable to participate in community-based programs due to their diagnosis. Pool programs include Zip and Dip – a modified Red Cross Swim Instruction program, Infant Swim and Family Swim.

Snoezelen: Provides a full range of sensory stimulation and enjoyable experiences in an atmosphere of trust and relaxation.

Special Services at Home: A government program which provides families with funding for respite or developmental programming.
